



- Report your data to Watershed Watch in Kentucky.

- Use the information you collected during your monitoring project to plan and conduct a community service project.
- Project ideas include conducting a streambank tree planting, installing pet waste stations at community parks, stenciling storm drains, hosting a watershed festival to teach others the importance of protecting our water resources

What is Juntos 4-H

Juntos 4-H is a program that helps Latino youth (9th-12th grade) and their parents gain the knowledge and skills needed to bridge the gap between high school and post-secondary options. Increasing High School Graduation Rates and helping families have a plan for success after graduation.

Population

6% of K-12 students are Latino. The Latino Population in Kentucky has grown 917.87% from 1990-2022.

The graduation rate of Latino Youth in Kentucky is 84% compared to 92% for their white classmates.

Impacts

87% of youth feel confident they will continue their education after high school.

91% of youth improved their grades in school.

92% of youth feel confident they will graduate from high school.

100% of youth in the program in the last 5 years have graduated high school.

Program Layout

Family Workshops- Set six family workshops to help parents and youth set family educational goals. Family Engagement- Quarterly Family engagement nights to build a community of support.

4-H Club- 4-H club meets twice a month focusing on tutoring, public speaking, life skills, and community service.

Summer Academy- A three-day event on UK's campus focused on college prep.
